## **SECTION 2**

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The State Advocacy workshop of HERFON was designed as one of the instruments for responding to the obvious gap and almost nil absence in the headquarter's expected inter-relationship with the states in building capacities and adequate knowledge on the context and content of HSR and how it can be promoted, supported and sustained. The interactive and participatory approach was conducive to peer learning. The proceedings included papers on

- HERFON yesterday, today and tomorrow
- Overview of the Health Status of Nigerians
- Overview of the Health Sector Reform
- Enugu State HSR responses and delivery

The group works were designed to focus on the perceived problems and their solutions in the states.

The conclusions were that the workshop were worth the while and that the participants appreciated the efforts to cascade exposure to HSR issues, policy expectations, the strategies and programme delivery with special emphasis on MDGs down to the primary (grass-roots) level through the LG actors. The participants are also willing to be active members of HERFON at that level if the platform could be provided.

The recommendations include

- Communications through advocacy and sensitization should be seen as very critical for winning the skeptical over to the goodness of HSR
- HERFON should find ways to sustain the effort especially at the primary level
- HERFON at the states and zones should be assisted through technical, material and financial support to deepen the membership down the ladder and possibly state create cells of apostles of Good Health for All Nigerians
- The outcomes of these workshops should widely publicized.

## **SECTION 3**

### **INTRODUCTION**

An emergency meeting of the South East zone of HERFON was summoned by the Zonal Champion on July 29, 2005. The meeting was attended by the representatives of the 5 states that make up the zone. There, the ZC extensively briefed the participants on the progress within HERFON since its launch in July, 2004. He outlined the expected activities at the zonal and state chapters and passionately reminded the states on the need to be up and running so that the organization could make the desired impacts, especially at the grass-root. He informed the participants about a work plan activity – an advocacy seminar/workshop in all the states – preceded by a zonal meeting and appealed to all the states to mobilize and organize the meetings by the end of October, 2005. He also announced that some support was available to each state seminar from HERFON headquarters.

### **The project aims and approach**

#### **1. OBJECTIVES**

- To breath life into the activities of state chapters of HERFON
- To extend the sensitization and advocacy to key stakeholders at the LG level on issues context and content of HSR
- To introduce HERFON, her vision, mission, activities and expected impact to the participatants
- To encourage the participants on the need for pro-active engagement with larger society on the benefits of HSR

#### **2. SCOPE**

New invitees were carefully selected in line with discussions with the ZC to ensure that at least 3 health actors in each LG, representatives of NGOs, State and Federal institutions, the private sector (including FBOs) and consumers, should be formally written to participate.

- Participants introduced to and/or acquire improved knowledge of HSR

- Percolation of the need for HSR to lower levels through proactive engagement of the environment by the participants
- Expansion of membership of the state HERFON
- A more vibrant Enugu state HERFON

## 5. METHODOLOGY

The format was participatory and interactive through modules (annex ).

### **Workshop Activities**

Enugu state HERFON resolved to set the pace by organizing a credible and impact generating workshop. The state Exco met and set up a task team under the supervision of the State Champion (Dr. E. Offiah) and LOC Chairmanship of Pharm. Ugbene. An emergency meeting which was well attended was summoned to brief members and ensure appropriate focus on this activity. The meeting approved the constitution and membership of the task team and encouraged to go ahead and deliver.

There was several exchange of mails with the Zonal Champion towards the build up to ensure the achievement of the expected outcome.

The greatest challenge was how to mobilize the target participants especially from the Local Government areas. The viable option apart from invitation letters that were sent was to use personal with the relevant persons and authorities at the LGs and this was done.

The workshop was held on October 14, 2005 at Modotel hotel conference hall. The attendance was impressive and it included the HERFON Champion of Ebonyi state and HERFON secretary of Imo state. It commenced with a prayer from Sr. Ifeoma Onyia of Annunciation Specialist Hospital, Enugu. The meeting was declared open by the HCH Enugu state through a representative.

In the address by HCH he praised the originators and facilitators of HERFON for their vision and commitment. He observed that the reform being by HERFON was in line with the policy direction of Enugu state Health process that has the District Health System as its bedrock.

The zonal champion presented three papers namely

- HERFON yesterday, today and tomorrow – presented on behalf of the ES.

- Overview of Health Status of Nigerians
- Overview of the on-going Health Sector Reform

The participants were then divided into 5 Groups to review Enugu Health care delivery system identifying its **Constraints (problems) and Solutions in two parts; namely, as Providers and as Consumers**. This session was conducted, by Dr. Tony Eloike, the Zonal Secretary. The result of analysis is quite interesting as it gives a better insight into the problems that should be addressed by Health Sector Reforms, from mainly the operators mainly at the primary level. The solutions they proffered for the problems added more value to the exercise. However, the analysis also showed that the health care providers were more pre-occupied with their welfare than ensuring efficient service delivery and consumer satisfaction. Also, issues like poor personnel update training, politicization of the service and the consequent entronement of mediocrity and indiscipline, the perennial O/S syndrome and consumer inaccessibility of services due to badly located facilities were significantly recurrent.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

Communications through advocacy and sensitization should be seen as very critical for winning the skeptical over to the goodness of HSR

HERFON should find ways to sustain the effort especially at the primary level

HERFON at the states and zones should be assisted through technical, material and financial support to deepen the membership down the ladder and possibly state create cells of apostles of Good Health for All Nigerians

The outcomes of these workshops should widely publicized.

The participants were enthused and showed active involvement and interest from the beginning to the end. Questions were liberally asked and appropriate answers were given. Non-HERFON participants wanted more of such workshops format including the style of the presentations that were informative and educative and still very easy to follow and understand. They will want HERFON to take this type of advocacy workshop to the LGs and possibly the grassroots to carry the communities and the consumers along. Most participants indicated interest to become active members of HERFON.

Resolutions, for taken the HERFON advocacy and sensitization process forward were passed.

We of Enugu state HERFON are grateful to the HERFON headquarters for the technical and financial support that made the seminar possible and to the Zonal Champion of the South East for the technical guidance and facilitation of the activity.

In 2001 DFID and FMOH commenced a programme – CHANGE AGENT PROGRAMME (CAP) – whose core goal is to create a critical mass of change agents through capacity building in the Health Sector, that will catalyze the change in knowledge, attitude and practice.

The programme was adjudged by international review as a success and the products are amongst main drivers of on-going Health Sector Reform activities in the past three (3) years.
